### Regulations for the Season of the Great Fast

Monday, February 26 is the first day of the Great Fast, a day of strict fast and abstinence.

Traditionally, the monastic fast of strict fasting and abstinence from all meat and dairy products on all the days of the Great Fast was observed by all the faithful; however, this is no longer obligatory and the current regulations for Byzantine Catholics are as below:

**Simple Abstinence** forbids the use of meat, but permits the use of eggs and dairy products. All faithful who receive the Eucharist are obliged to **observe simple abstinence on all Wednesdays** and **Fridays of the Great Fast**.

**Strict Abstinence** (fasting) forbids the use and consumption of all meat, eggs and dairy products. All faithful who receive the Eucharist are obliged to **observe strict abstinence on Pure Monday**, **February 27** (the first day of the Great Fast) and Great and Holy Friday.

As we journey through the Great Fast towards the glorious day of Resurrection, we are also encouraged to give alms, to nourish our souls as often as possible with the Divine Eucharist, to participate in spiritual exercises, and to make special acts of repentance and Christian charity. It is important to keep in mind that fasting is not a law for us—rather, a voluntary way of remembering not to sin and to help keep our focus on prayer, repentance and doing acts of kindness, for we "are not under the law but under grace" (Romans 6:14).

**Spiritual Exercises This Week.** As we embark on the Great Fast all are encouraged to avail themselves of the parish's spiritual exercises:

Presanctified Divine Liturgy: Wednesday and Friday, 7:30PM. The Holy Eucharist is the source of Life and the fulfillment of our very existence. Since the Divine Liturgy is a joyful commemoration of Christ's Resurrection, its celebration on weekdays of Lent is forbidden. Rather, the Church prescribes the evening Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts during which the Divine and Holy Eucharist is distributed. These days being days of abstinence are thereby "crowned" with the partaking of the Bread of Life.

**Lenten Supper**: After Liturgy each Friday, we share a meatless pot-luck supper; we come together as a Christian community in the name of our Lord to encourage each other on our Lenten journey.

**Spiritual Reading**: **Friday**, **6:30PM**. Before the Friday Liturgy we meet to discuss *The Way of the Disciple*, an extraordinary book which shows the way to companionship with Jesus and how to "become wet clay" in the His hands so that He can transform us into the person God wants us to be.

<u>Lenten Meditations and the Third Hour</u>: **Sunday**, **9:15AM**. Join us before the Divine Liturgy to discuss the theme of each week of the Great Fast. On March 5, our topic will be "*The Prayer of Saint Ephrem*, *Answering Christ's Call*". Afterwards at **9:40AM**, we will pray the **Third Hour** of the Church's Divine Praises.
