


The Light of the East ...

Lenten Spring Begins. Today we begin our spiritual and liturgical preparation for the Great Fast, which begins this year on Monday, February 12. Today's Gospel is about Zacchaeus the tax-collector. It tells how Christ brought salvation to the sinful man and how his life was greatly changed simply because he “sought to see who Jesus was” (Luke 19:3). The desire and effort to see Jesus is the first movement of salvation; it begins the entire movement through the Great Fast towards the glorious feast of Pascha.

Let us begin our journey with recognition of our own sinfulness, just as Zacchaeus recognized his. The example of the tax-collector teaches us that we should turn away from our sins and atone for them. The real proof of our sorrow and repentance is not just a verbal apology; rather it is found when we correct ourselves and try to make amends for the consequences of our sinful actions.

Zacchaeus was a short person, so he climbed a tree in order to see the Lord. We too as sinners have come short of the glory of God (Rom. 3:23). Let us begin to climb the ladder of virtues and prepare for spiritual effort and growth. We are assured of God's mercy and compassion by Christ's words to Zacchaeus, “Today salvation is come to this house” (Luke 19:9).

Eastern Christian Faith Formation. Children's “Sunday School” will begin later this month. Details and registration will begin next week. For high school students and adults, Fr. Deacon James will continue his class on the **Petateuch** of the Bible starting **February 19** and Fr. Deacon Michael will offer his class on the **Pillars of Byzantine Spirituality** starting **April 8**.

As the harvesters of the Lord's vineyard, it is our duty to be educated and well-informed of our Eastern Catholic faith in order to build up the Kingdom of God and to grow in our own personal relationship with the Most Holy Trinity. Our parish Faith Formation program seeks to nurture an encounter with God that leads each of us into a deepening communion with Him. Please make every effort to enroll children in Sunday School and to attend Adult Education classes.
