will need more time to settle in since the rectory will not be completed until the end of July. After the rectory is complete, and he has been able to settle into his life there and to create a functioning parish office, we will then begin to add services. Fr. Lewis thanks you for your patience.

HOLYDAYS AND GREAT VESPERS: Throughout the year there are feasts which commemorate essential events in the life of Christ, His Mother the Most Holy Theotokos, and the Saints. These feasts are classified in three tiers: **Simple, Solemn, and Obligation.** A faithful Catholic in Good Standing is expected to attend the Divine Liturgy on all days of Obligation—Sunday being a day of obligation as well. Solemn, and Simple feast days are not required attendance but their celebration is highly encouraged. These are all feast days on which Litija is celebrated along with the Mirovanija anointing with blessed oil.

Celebrating these feasts reminds us of the important events which brought this knowledge of salvation to us today. We should not look at these days as a burden because we are obliged to make every effort to attend the Divine Liturgy, but we should look towards these days as a *opportunities* to celebrate the Divine Liturgy and to receive Our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ Bodily in the form of the Most Holy Eucharist. It is this action and reception which continues to sanctify us and to confirm the gift of salvation that we have been given and have willfully accepted.

The celebration of Great Vespers helps us to better understand the details of the feast. Great Vespers is just one of many possible services prayed throughout the day in a collection known as The Divine Office. These services are: Vespers,

Compline, Midnight Office, Matins, First Hour, Third Hour, Sixth Hour, and the Ninth Hour. This is the cycle of daily services that monks and nuns would keep in a monastery, but we can also pray them in the parish setting. By praying these services, we are better prepared for the splendor that is the Divine Liturgy. However, please keep in mind, that attending Great Vespers will not satisfy one's feast day obligation.

—Definitions—

Prothesis: The area at the north end of the sanctuary, most often set within a conch, where the priest makes ready the Holy Gifts of the bread and wine before they are carried to the Altar. The word is derived from the verb pro-tithemi, meaning 'to place before.' The Service of Preparation, the Proskomide, is also known as Prothesis.

Proskomide: From the verb proskomizo meaning 'to carry and convey to,' Proskomide was originally the name given to the Great Entrance when the Holy Gifts were carried to the Altar. Today it primarily refers to the actual Service of Preparation, which takes place before the Divine Liturgy, during which the priest prepares the eucharistic Gifts of bread and wine for the celebration of the Mystery.
